TARDINESS

Tardiness, although the child is ultimately in attendance, is disruptive to class continuity, and distracting for both the educator and students who have already begun the week's lesson. Students who arrive after the start of class are considered tardy. Excessive tardiness will be brought to the parents attention and cannot be allowed to continue.
